

Cashmore Early Years Centre Newsletter March 2025

Well, Spring is in the air and there is a wonderful atmosphere in school at the moment. Children have loved experiencing the elements in the garden - splashing in puddles, playing in the mud and even exploring hail stones! We are delighted that the children who have moved groups are adapting very well to new their environments.



Hippo and Giraffe Groups (2-year-olds)

In group times this month, we have been building using different kinds of construction toys, in particular the small wooden blocks and magnetic Duplo. This kind of play is important because it helps the children to build strength, control and coordination in their fingers. They are also learning to use the names of the other children in their group. We have been learning about people who help us, using dolls and puppets. We also marked the start of Lent by tasting pancakes and choosing toppings. Yummy!

We have been singing *Five little men in a flying saucer* (you can sing along at home <u>Five little men in a flying</u> <u>saucer - BBC Teach</u>) and *Five Little Ducks* (you can sing along at home <u>Five Little Ducks - CBeebies</u>). This is a fabulous opportunity for your child to learn counting skills.

Our core book is The Very Hungry Caterpillar.



Zebra and Tiger Groups (3-year-olds)

During group times this month, we have been following the children's interest in construction, using more complex building resources such as Mobilo. We have introduced small world play to our construction, building houses and vehicles for animals and people. At the start of Lent, we had the opportunity to taste pancakes with toppings of our choice – what a nice treat!

We have been singing the counting song 5 *little men in a flying saucer* (you can sing along <u>Five little men in a</u> <u>flying saucer - BBC Teach</u>) and we use cubes in a pot to represent the aliens in the song. We are learning to take away one alien at a time and notice how many are left.

Our core book is *Tanka, Tanka Skunk!* We are learning to clap the syllables of the words ("Tan-ka, tan-ka, skunk!"). We have also been reading *1, 2, 3 Do the Dinosaur* in preparation for our story session at the Wellspring Settlement (see below).



OUTDOOR PLAY

Did you know? Playing and learning outdoors improves confidence, self-esteem, social skills, communication, co-operative working, motivation, physical skills, knowledge and understanding.

Our outdoor area at Cashmore is planned so that all the things children learn inside can also be learned outside – and there are even more learning opportunities outside.



Being outside more often allows your child to develop a stronger immune system and a resistance to allergies. Studies have shown that children who are active outside have the best overall health. You do need to be properly dressed outside, so please make sure that your child has waterproof boots and a real waterproof coat.

Prompt pick up

Please remember that the morning session finishes at 12.00pm (gates open at 11.50am). Staff have lunch 12.00-12.30pm to ensure they are ready and available for all the children during the afternoon session. The afternoon session finishes at 3.30pm (gates open at 3.20pm). We open the gate 10 minutes beforehand to allow time to talk with you at handover/collection.

School meals

School meals must be paid for IN ADVANCE via ParentPay. The school cannot keep arrears, and it is likely to lead to meals being stopped.

If your child is 3 and you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may well be entitled to free school meals. If you think you may be entitled, please ask at Reception.

Your child's bag

Please put enough **nappies and wipes** for the session (if they are in nappies/pull-ups) and **spare clothes (including socks)** in case we have to change children after toileting accidents or from water play. **PLEASE WRITE YOUR CHILD'S NAME IN ALL CLOTHES.**

Nursery clothes

If your child comes home in nursery clothes, please return as soon as possible.

Toys brought into nursery

Please encourage your child to **KEEP TOYS AT HOME**. Toys from home are likely to get lost, broken or cause conflict. Staff are not responsible for the whereabouts of toys brought in from home.

Snack donation

Thank you to the parents who continue to donate to the children's snack time. The school provides milk, but we rely on donations from parents for snack times during the morning and afternoon sessions. The children eat **fresh fruit** (e.g. apples, bananas, oranges, pears) or **vegetables** (e.g. carrots, cucumbers). We would be grateful if you could **donate fruit weekly OR you can make a small money donation** in the tin provided in the garden/Reception at drop-off times.



Parking

Please DO NOT BLOCK THE ROAD, DOUBLE PARK OR BLOCK OTHER VEHICLES IN (even for a short period of time) when dropping off/picking up outside the Centre as it is causing frustration to the residents and there will not be enough room for emergency vehicles to get down the road. We understand drop off/pick up is a busy time of day outside the Centre, but we encourage everyone to always be tolerant and respectful. Abusive behaviour is not acceptable.

Clothes and wellies

As the weather is cold, children will need appropriate clothing and footwear. We go into the garden in all weathers! Please could you provide your child with a **pair of wellies** if possible. Please also put lots of **spare clothes** in their bag in case of getting wet/toileting accidents and a **coat** as the weather is changeable. Please **write your child's name in their clothes/wellies**. Wet weather gear and 'all weather' suits are also a very good way to keep children dry and can be purchased quite reasonably.



Outdoor Reflective Framework



Both of our sites (St Philip's Marsh Nursery School and Cashmore Early Years Centre) have been awarded The Outdoor Play and Learning Reflective Framework Quality Improvement Certificate! Our joint submission was coordinated by Kim (teacher at St Philip's). The validation panel looked at all the evidence submitted and sent us a detailed response, which can be found attached. 


World Book Day celebration

Your benefits for children are clear and relevant to your targets. It has been an absolute joy to look at all your evidence which enabled us to feel we were in your setting and we look forward to your updates moving forward.

Your involvement as participants has been key in ensuring this is a valuable and userfriendly reflective framework which we can share with the wider early year's community.
